| Activities     | Spin-A-Kid<br><br>Our Family Tree<br><br>Love Walk - put hearts on Bishop's door and Primary door.<br><br>I laminated (large) 10-inch hearts cut from various patterned papers (could be more effective if they were all different solid colors). I gave each child a heart and asked them to hold up their heart if the action I described showed love for others; the other teachers helped them. Examples of the descriptions I used were "I ran to my dad when he got home from work and gave him a big hug," "I put away all the coloring crayons after I was done coloring a picture just like my mom asked me to," "I tell my mom, dad, sister, and brothers 'I love you' every night after family prayers." <u>All</u> of the descriptions were examples of loving others. Then I collected the hearts and placed them on the floor in a large circle. Each child stood on a heart and we walked from heart to heart around the circle singing "Jesus Said Love Everyone." When the song was over, I picked one child to tell me how they show love to someone special to them. If they couldn't say it, we would act it out.
